Roll Call by Folger

Minutes: The minutes of the November 28 conference call meeting were reviewed. Motion to accept Dryburgh, second by Lowrance: vote unanimous.

Smithfield Update: Gill announced that Alyssa Hamel from Smithfield Corporate will be assisting at the Summer Event. He urged all State programs to reach out to their local Smithfield folks for in-kind assistance.

NACD Updates: Dremmel

- Brooks is assisting NC with various program duties for this summer.
- They are working on a prospectus for the North American Program. Planning with the future hosts.
- Working on the Annual Report
- They are participating on the Next Gen Leadership initiative, a NACD program to create a broad vision for the future.
- \$25K was raised and matched to create an endowment fund to support future leadership.
- This Monday the Next Generation Initiative will be launched.

NCF Updates: Schmidt, Redding:

- The Leadership program can help Districts with resources to help training efforts.
- They are documenting the history of the Ethon program.
- They have revised past financing The Annual Report is due to be released
- Program update: Brooks:
 - The year-end review, the Annual report will be an outreach resource.
 - Working with Steach to evaluate progress of the event to prepare to work with Nebraska in 2020.
 - She gave Smithfield the State/Province event dates.

- Robinson stated that they have changed the Mission statement for the NCF with a stress on developing new conservation leaders.
- They have reached out to North American organization of environmental educators.
- Discussion on social media outreach.

Public Relations Updates: Waycott

Idaho - Rocky leading into Idaho and even the first couple of days prior to the event starting were difficult. End of the day the evaluations were good. Better than 2017 and certainly better than 2016.

Memory of the opening – two days prior stressful. The opening took a turn and was fantastic. Why was it stressful, there was no connection with the school on IT needs for the opening or the event. i.e. mikes, screens, etc.

Teaching/Testing sites - Rangeland – locations was questionable. End of the day it was "the most beautiful part of the country I have ever seen" Student. The memories of the beauty of the that area will stay with the student forever.

Cash Award – This year we were required to collect W-9 from the students receiving cash awards. Simple task ...No! October before the last check was cashed. Took multiply emails, phones to get the students to fill out the papers first, then to get them to cash the checks. Senior students - gone off to college, changed their emails etc.

Membership Dues – Currently 26 states/provinces have paid. Three states have paid \$ 550.00. Indiana, Ohio and West Virginia. (\$1050.00)

Intent to Participate – Official 48 submitted (Michigan, New Hampshire, Texas, BC, NS, NL and China 1 (?)) Possible 55 teams. Louisiana – Jennifer has had some contact with Tomeka and they are having a state competition, but pending their scores if they will send them to NC. 70% is the min allowable score.

State/Provincial Competitions: March - 4, April - 20 May - 24, June - 2

Diversity Grants - Call for applications was sent out and the deadline is February 15, 2019.

Currently we believe that the USFS will continue to support this program for 2019. The interim and final reports were sent to Sue Cummings this past fall. Challenge continues to get the recipients who receive the grants to submit their reports to our office and turn them around into the format that the USFS requires. Each state/province that receives a grant is required to sign a "Letter of Acceptance" which clearly states when they must submit their reports.

FYI: Sue Cummings will be retiring from the USFS the end March and had planned to be here but do to the government shut-down she had to cancel.

North Carolina Tests - Soils Test reviews are back. Jennifer and I have been working with the NC test group with the suggested edits and they are working through the second draft. Not expecting any issues there Gail seems to have things under control.

FYI: Jennifer helped with the review this year and it was great to get her involved and part of the reviewing process! Last year this did not happen again it is great to have Jennifer and she is digging in and getting things done.

NACD for example charges \$100.00 for their AGM. Typically, we have 4-6 refunds a year. If they pay by P/Pal then there is also the issue of the P/Pal costs. 8% is charged by P/P to process a payment, then another % is charged to process a refund. If it is a check, they contact me, then I have to spend about 30 minutes on them, get the information to John, he has to issue the check. The check costs, envelope, stamp and John's time.

Website

Process of totally re-doing the website using Word Press. The current website is done in Joomba and is difficult software to work with and requires lots of codes etc.

 - Discussion on the number of slides allowed: current limit of 20 slides for the PowerPoint presentation.
 - 10 sheets of poster board per team for the non-digital presentations.
 - Top three teams will re-present.
 - Motion: approve the draft guidelines from NC for the 2019 event by Lowrance, second by Hume. Vote, unanimous.
 - Advisor tours: NC Zoo. After testing the NC Museum of Natural History.
 - Fun Day: Trip to the NC coast.
 - Volunteer numbers and assignments are compete.

2020 Event: Nebraska: Dryburgh

- Date: July 26 to August 1st
- Finances: \$160K raised and \$80K committed.
- Committees have been formed.
- Training and Testing sites have been preliminarily been chosen.
- Orals: PowerPoint, possibly giving the scenario out prior to the event. This will shorten the event by one day. The final decision will be announced at the summer meeting.
- The Current Issue: "Water Resource Management, Local Control, Local Solutions".
- Location: Univ. of Nebraska in Lincoln. Omaha or Lincoln airports, no shuttle will be provided.

2021 Event: New Brunswick, Geneau

- July 26th to July 31st
- Location either Sackville of Fredrickton
- Possible Current Issue: "Climate Change"

2022 Event: Ohio, Dodds:

- Possible location: Bowling Green Univ. or Ohio State Univ.
- Possible Topic: "Water Quality"

Committee Reports:

- Education Committee: Folger reported that many of the links for the study guides were no longer available. A major overhaul is needed to locate and provide new links.

New Business:

- Review of the Operating Committee Guidelines
- Discussion on the Operating Committee vacancies. Consensus: advise the NCF board to fill the recent vacancies. Advise the NCF board to consider advisory roles/position to the Operating Committee.
- Revise/Update the oral judge's note-taking sheet. Discussion on using references to validate the oral presentation and how to score the use of references. Require: state references and submit the written references to the judges, up to five points will be awarded. A reference format sheet will be provided in each packet.
- Dave Vogel addressed the Committee. He proposed that a survey be done to determine whether Districts involve Native American Tribes. The question could be placed on the list serve.
- Generic Schedule and Outline for Training to be included in the Host Guide. Past hosts to submit samples.
- National Middle School Envirothon Proposal: Discussion on trademark renewal and dates. The trademark the "National Envirothon" expired in 2004. It needs to be renewed. *The Committee agreed to recommend to the NCF to trademark the name*

"Envirothon". We need to review past bylaws and standardize with present policies. *Recommend to the NCF that a Middle School Envirothon is not feasible at this time due to a lack of funding and resources within the NCF.*

- Digital presentations: Nebraska is considering the distribution of the scenario prior to the summer event.
- Discussion on community outreach projects.
- Hall of Fame: Add an Advisor category to the Hall of Fame. Betty Holly proposed adding the category recognizing an "Outstanding Envirothon Advisor" award.
- On-Line Competition: a state has proposed to hold their competition online. *Consensus:* No objection from the Operating Committee.
- Questions from the State/Provincial Reps: "Has there been a strategic plan developed by the NCF for the Envirothon"? Answer: The NCF has a business plan, but it is not public at this time.
