LOGISTICS

Content

Content and outcomes are greatly reduced Focus is on hands-on activities and higher-order thinking Questions are designed around equipment being sent

LOGISTICS

Competing

Teams compete from their own school or home

Test can be on paper or online (need to choose platform)

Advisors will attend a virtual training session

1-week event to accommodate proctors and judging

LOGISTICS

Test Day

Test kit is delivered to teams and remains unopened until the test

Team training online

One volunteer proctor per team to observe and/or be the point of contact during the test (or trained teacher)

Option of 2-days to complete the test (but must abide by given time slot)

Orals

Team training online

Question given to teams 2.5 hours before scheduled presentation time on Zoom/Teams (2 hrs to prep, $\frac{1}{2}$ hr break)

Teams Physically Separated	Members train individually but collaborate via phone or video.	Each member is sent a theme kit and full test at a set time.	Question given 2 ½ hours ahead of set time. Teams appoint one 'creator' of presentation and present as a team.
Individual Participation	Reduced amount of content: focus on 2 theme areas only.	Participants are sent kit and test at a set time.	Adapted question given 2 ½ hours ahead of set time. Individual presentation.



	Training	Field Test	Orals
Off-Line Participation	Send USB with all training needs	Send kit with paper test. Teacher gives kit and test at set time. Test is given to teacher to scan and submit.	Question given and judged via telephone.
Middle Years Program	Reduced amount of content in all 5 areas. Short, specialized training.	Focus is on hands-on kit-based items. All members sent the same kit and can work individual or as a team.	Question given one hour ahead of set judging time. Focus is on conversation rather than presentation.

DISTANCE EDUCATION

- 1. Hands-on, collaborative, analyze, apply, evaluate, create
- 2. Sparingly: recall, define, classify
- 3. Maintain a semblance of original event

EVENT FORMAT

- 1. Held over 7 days
 - May 3-10, 2021
 - Monday at 9am Monday at 9am
- 2. Given field test and orals question at same time
- 3. Open book
 - Regional documents





HOW DO WE DO THAT?

- 1. Test will be on a fillable locked word document
 - Limits the amount of space to write answers in
 - Print certain pages to show work (mathematical questions)
 - Test can be printed and mailed
 - Test can be put on USB and mailed
 - Test can be sent via email
- Materials for test will be mailed out to all team members
 - Still want to have hands on!
- 3. Will need test explanation letter (rules) to go with the test





REGISTRATION


- 1. Teams can be made up of any 5 members from anywhere in Manitoba
 - Can assist in partnering up team members
 - Ideally from same school
 - 1 advisor per 2 teams max
 - Fee: \$75/person or \$375/team
- 2. New registration form indicating technical abilities of team
 - Each member of team identifies:
 - Advisors (printer capabilities)
 - Discipline specialty
 - Devices (what type computer/iPad, etc)
 - Access to internet?
 - T-shirt sizes

FORMAT — ORALS

- Given orals question at same time as the field test
- 2. Presentation will be community based
- 3. Presentation Options:
 - Record a video and submit with field test (mail or email)
 - Audio Recording recorded and submitted (mail or email)
 - Set up phone call
- 4. One judging panel to review all presentations



MARKING

- 1. Over 2-week period (new format, remote marking)
- Convert all tests received to PDF so can be uploaded onto marking site
 - Use Genius scan on phone, or computer software
- 3. One person uploads all PDFs to a website called Xodo
 - https://www.xodo.com/#
 - It is a pdf collaboration tool that you can upload and annotate pdfs without having to download them to your computer.
 - Can work on it at the same time
- 4. Test Markers upload their marks on the site
- Chairs then get gather all marks from site and put into google sheets
