

Jennifer Brooks, NCF-Envirothon Program Manager, welcomed everyone to the December meeting of Envirothon Program Representatives.



During the 2023 competition year, Envirothon programs and competitions were held by 52 Envirothon Program Partners in 4 countries around the world.




#### B. 2024 Membership

By December 31, all state, provincial, and partner nation Envirothon programs are asked to:


- Fill out a <u>2024 Membership Registration and</u> <u>Dues Invoice</u> form

- Submit form and complete payment online or mail-in payment




#### B. Registration Confirmation Email and Invoice PDF

- an attached PDF invoice to save and/or print for your records.






The email will be sent to the email address you entered on the form. Be sure to check your SPAM or quarantine folders as email security may flag the email as potential spam.


- 1. To outline what skills and knowledge are needed to be successful at the annual international competition,

- 3. To guide states, provinces, and partner nation Envirothon programs in developing their *own* learning objectives and curricula.



# **Learning Objectives**

- They are NOT mandatory, but an Envirothon program may decide to use them in their entirety, use only portions of them, or use none at all in their <u>local</u> state/provincial-level competitions.
- Meant to serve as a <u>guide</u> for your state/provincial programs can be adapted to be more specific to your local ecology
- Encompass a high level of knowledge and skills, which may surpass what is expected at your state/provincial competition
- Developed to be **comprehensive** in scope and depth, with the understanding that not every learning objective will be relevant to every state or province!
- Are a good overview of the types of knowledge and skills expected of students at the NCF-Envirothon annual competition each July.









# **Diversity Grant**

# **Diversity Grant Application**

- U.S. Applicants can request up to \$4,000
- Canadian Applicants can request up to \$2,000
- Applications must have a 25% budget match from monetary and/or inkind sources
- Proposals must be DETAILED Reviewers should have a clear picture of your project and how you plan to accomplish it.
- Budgets must be ITEMIZED Don't just list "educational supplies": Name which type of supply and how much each costs.
