

Getting to Alberta, Canada


- Team(s) entering Canada from the USA and Singapore will require a valid passport. See <u>Entering</u>
 <u>Canada Travel.gc.ca</u>
- Team(s) from China will require a valid passport and a Visa. See <u>Entry requirements by country or</u>
 <u>territory Canada.ca</u>
- The #YYC airport is located 24.7 kms (15.4 miles) from Mount Royal University (MRU) and travel from the airport to MRU should take no more than 25 minutes regardless of travel option
- Direct shuttle service will provide a list for each team to choose from
 - Note that there are several travel options within the city = direct shuttle service, Uber/Lyft, ride share, taxi, bus, Light Rail Transit (C train)



West Residence Apartment Complex







West Residence Townhouses

Registration Fees in USD

- Team Registration = \$2,300
- 1-Day Team Early Arrival (\$400)
- Advisor/Chaperone Single Room = no charge (all rooms are single occupancy at MRU)
- Advisor/Chaperone kitchen/living room fee = \$150/person
- 1-Day Guest Early Arrival = \$80/person
- 2-Day Operating Committee Early Arrival = \$150/person
- On-Campus Guest = \$800/person
- Off-Campus Guest = \$400/person
- Day Guest: Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday = \$100/person/day
- Day Guest: Wednesday = \$150/person
- Parking pass = use parking app once you arrive at MRU for designated areas
- Non-registered Guest Awards banquet ticket = \$30/person
